

Class Objectives, Curriculum and Schedule

Overall Objectives for the week:

- Each student will have a clear understanding of the Gospel and how it applies to them.
- Each student will have personal connection with a believer.
- Each student will use computers for communication.
- Each student will improve job skills and employment possibilities.
- Each student will know what eLC resources are available to them.

Computer Topics Covered

- Day 1 **Introduction** - Get acquainted with the computer, terminology (mouse, keyboard, monitor, hard drive, etc.), finger chart for keyboard, show them typing program**, explain folders and desktop, shut down computer.
- Day 2 **Word** - Learn basic Word skills
- Day 3 **Drawing Tools** - Learn basic Drawing skills then combine with Word skills learned on previous day to draw pictures
- Day 4 **Photo editing** - Pictures are taken of students and loaded onto server. Pictures of mountains, cities, lakes, etc. are also loaded. Students learn to edit pictures, crop themselves out of one picture and put themselves "on vacation" by a lake or on the Eiffel Tower, etc. They also add in their Drawing and Word skills to create a "masterpiece". Invitations to the "Graduation Ceremony" at church on Sunday can also be made up and printed, providing there is a color printer available. Students can hand these out to their friends.
- Day 5 **Internet** - Ethics, Web Searching and Email
**** Typing practice is encouraged in every class.**

Spiritual Topics Covered

- Day 1 God as Creator/God's Existence
- Day 2 Sin and our separation from God
- Day 3 God's Unconditional Love
- Day 4 Jesus Payment for our Sin and Provision for our Reconciliation to God
- Day 5 Need and Ways to Grow in our Faith and Relationship with God

Suggested 3-Hour Class Schedule:

- 45 minutes Teaching and practicing
- 30 minutes Chapel talk and team member testimony
- 30 minutes Break - great time for interacting and discussing what they thought about the Chapel talk and testimony
- 30 minutes Class with teaching and practicing
- 45 minutes Practice Time

Generally two classes will be offered each day, one in the afternoon and one in the evening. There will usually be 2-3 students per computer, but this is no problem for them as they are accustomed to sharing and are very good about helping each other. It works best to have one team member at each computer and one translator if possible. All teaching from the front of the room will be translated into the local language.

The computers are all loaded with the local language. It is therefore important for the team members to become familiar with where the various commands are ahead of time.
